## Arbor Day 2015

- WHEREAS, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and
- WHEREAS, this Holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and
- WHEREAS, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and
- WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, reduce heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen, provide habitat for wildlife and reduce stormwater runoff; and
- WHEREAS, trees are a renewable resource, giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires, and countless other wood products. Trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community and wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Griffin has appointed an Environmental Council to facilitate and oversee the planting of trees in the city; and
- WHEREAS, he City has pruned and mulched trees throughout the City's right-of-way; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Griffin has been recognized as a Tree City USA by the National Arbor Day Foundation and desires to continue its tree-planting ways.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** that Board of Commissioners of the City of Griffin do hereby proclaim Friday, February 20, 2015 as

in the City of Griffin and urge all citizens to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands and to support our city's urban forestry programs and to plant trees to promote the well-being of present and future generations.
